COMPANIES AUTHORIZED TO DO BUSINESS IN PUERTO RICO

Dear Sirs:


Enclosed please find blank forms for the filing of the Company's Report and Statement of Reconciliation of Premiums Written corresponding to business transacted by your company in the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico during the calendar year 1965. We are also enclosing blank forms for the filing of your Windstorm Insurance Experience, if such type of insurance was transacted during the calendar year 1965. These reports must be completed in their entirety and filed with this office in addition to the Annual Statement.

You are reminded that the filing due date of the Annual Statement and its supporting schedules is March 31, 1966, and must be received in this office on or before that date, duly completed in their entirety. The filing date of the Insurance Expense Exhibit is May 1, 1966. We do not supply the form for the filing of the Insurance Expense Exhibit.

The Annual Statement must be filed in the official form approved by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners for the year 1965.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 3.310(2) of our Insurance Code, foreign insurers not organized in the United States which elect to file an Annual Statement relating to their United States business must file all that information pertaining to their Puerto Rico assets, affairs and transactions. This must include the information required on page 14 of the Annual Statement with respect to Puerto Rico business and information pertaining to transactions and holding of investments in Puerto Rico securities as of December 31, 1965, in the manner required in the Annual Statement. It is of utmost importance that this information be filed with the Annual Statement and within the filing due date.
