**CIRCULAR LETTER NO. CC-2017-1912-D**

**TO ALL INSURERS THAT PARTICIPATE IN THE COMPUSORY LIABILITY INSURANCE**

**EXTENSION OF THE EFFECTIVE TERM OF MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS AND COVERAGE OF COMPULSORY LIABILITY INSURANCE**

Dear Sirs and Madams:

On September 17, 2017, the Honorable Governor of Puerto Rico, Ricardo A. Rosselló-Nevarés, issued Executive Order OE-2017-047, decreeing a state of emergency in Puerto Rico, in view of the imminent impact of Hurricane María. Because of the emergency situation in Puerto Rico caused by the impact of Hurricane María, the Secretary of the Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTOP) on September 29, 2017 informed that there would be an extension of the effective term of motor registrations that expired on September 30 of this year, until services were reestablished at the Driver Services Centers (CESCO).

Likewise, this Office hereby advises the insurers that provide compulsory liability insurance coverage for motor vehicles whose registration had expired on September 30 of this year, that such is extended until services are reestablished at the CESCO. All insurers that provide compulsory liability insurance shall maintain the insurance in effect and honor insurance compulsory liability coverage issued to insured vehicles whose policies have expired on September 30 of this year, until CESCO are reestablished, as notified by the Secretary of the DTOP.
