TO ALL INSURERS OR HEALTH SERVICES ORGANIZATIONS THAT ARE AUTHORIZED TO TRANSACT INSURANCE BUSINESS IN PUERTO RICO, RATING BODIES, AUTOMOBILE CLUBS OR ASSOCIATIONS, SERVICE PROVIDERS, AND LICENSEES IN GENERAL

EXTENSION OF THE TERM FOR TACIT APPROVAL OF FORMS AND RATES FOR INSURANCE POLICIES OR CONTRACTS

Dear Sirs and Madams:

On September 4 and 17, 2017, the Governor of Puerto Rico, Hon. Ricardo A. Rosselló-Nevores, issued executive orders OE-2017-145 and OE-2017-047 declaring a state of emergency due to hurricanes Irma and María, respectively. Given this state of emergency, we are taking the necessary measures and actions to resume our normal operations and recommence as soon as possible the procedures that were suspended at our agency during this emergency situation.

In view of the above, and by virtue of the powers and capacities vested in the Commissioner of Insurance under Section 2.030 of the Insurance Code, 26 L.P.R.A. § 235, we are notifying that the date for the tacit approval of all rate filings or policy forms that would have been approved from September 4 to October 5, 2017, to include the former and the latter dates, will be extended for an additional 30 calendar days beginning on October 5, 2017.

Policy forms or rate filing forms that had been tacitly approved between September 4 and October 5, 2017, will not enter into effect until the end of the 30 additional calendar days or notice of approval or denial is provided at an earlier date.
